Smoke-Free Outdoor Spaces:

- ✓ Protect children from second hand smoke
- √ Make 'smoke-free' the positive role model
- ✓ Support people who are quitting
- ✓ Reduce litter from cigarette butts
- ✓ Reduce the risk of fire
- ✓ Prevent harmful chemicals from cigarette butts from leaching into soil and water
- ✓ Protect wildlife from ingesting harmful chemicals
- ✓ Denormalize tobacco use

What's the deal with second hand smoke?

It produces over 7,000 chemicals, containing nearly 70 cancer-causing compounds.

Second hand smoke (SHS) contains at least twice the nicotine and tar as first hand smoke.

Every year over 800 nonsmoking Canadians lose their lives to lung cancer and heart disease because of SHS.
